**Session 2:** The Blind Men and the Elephant: My Experience with KPA During the 2018 Detente



Betty Suh is Research Fellow at the German Council of Foreign Relations (DGAP) as well as PhD fellow at the Institute for Peace Studies and Security Policy at the University of Hamburg (IFSH). Her dissertation discusses North Korea's nuclear signaling vis-à-vis the US; her work includes issues of nuclear arms control and non-proliferation more broadly, particularly in the Asia-Pacific region. Betty was previously affiliated with the German Institute of International and Security Affairs (SWP), the Peace Research Institute Frankfurt (PRIF); among other opportunities, she has worked for the Organization of Security Co-operation in Europe (OSCE) as an external project consultant.

#### **NEA Keynote:** Navigating Strategic Shocks in Northeast Asia

Michael MacArthur Bosack is the Special Advisor for Government Relations at the Yokosuka Council on Asia-Pacific Studies and the founder of the Parley Policy Initiative. Previously, Michael served in the U.S. Air Force as a Foreign Area Officer. His last posting in the Air Force was as the Deputy Chief of Government Relations at Headquarters, U.S. Forces, Japan. Prior to that, Michael was a Mansfield Fellow, where he worked in the National Diet, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and Ministry of Defense. He completed his doctoral studies at the International University of Japan's Graduate School of International Relations. Michael's Ph.D. research examined Alliance Theory and Intergovernmental Negotiations, specifically focusing on the negotiations and outcomes of the 1997 and 2015 Defense Guidelines between the United States and Japan. His other research areas include North Korean Governance and Foreign Policy, Peacemaking, Postwar Occupation Policy, and Leadership Studies.

Bee Yun JO is Associate Research Fellow at Korea Institute for Defense Analyses (KIDA). She received M.A. and Ph.D. in International Studies from Graduate School of International Studies(GSIS), Seoul National University. Before joining KIDA in 2020, she was Research Professor at Institute of International Affairs(IIA), Seoul National University, and full-time lecturer at EastAsia International College(EIC), Yonsei University. Her research interests include nuclear-conventional deterrence, extended deterrence, alliance and armament in Northeast Asia. Her recent publications include US's Low-yield Nuclear Weapons and Extended Deterrence on the Korean Peninsula(Seoul: KIDA, 2021) and "Plan B for Non-Nuclear States in East Asia: Debating on Nuclear Latency as Means for Potential Deterrence" (National Strategy, Vol. 27, No. 4, 2021). Her publications also appear in Asian Perspective, International Relations of the Asia-Pacific, Korean Social Science Journal, Korean Journal of Security Affairs, and others. She is member of planning board of Korean Association for Political and Diplomatic History and advisory committee member of the National Unification Advisory Council.

Tetsuo KOTANI is a professor at Meikai University and a senior fellow at the Japan Institute of International Affairs (JIIA). His research focus is Japan's foreign/security policy, the US-Japan alliance, and international relations and maritime security in the Indo-Pacific region. He won the 2003 Japanese Defense Minister Prize. He has published numerous articles both in English and Japanese, and his recent English publications include "Crisis Management in the East China Sea" (SIPRI Policy Brief, 2015) and "China's Military and Paramilitary Activities in the East China Sea: Implications for the U.S.-Japan Alliance" (National Bureau of Asian Research, 2020). He received a master's degree from Doshisha University.
